Part 2: Our Programs



Dance Styles Offered

- Acro: A fusion of dance and acrobatic elements, this style incorporates gymnastic tricks like cartwheels, handsprings, and aerials into fluid choreography, showcasing strength, flexibility, and control.
- Ballet: A foundational and highly disciplined dance form characterized by precise, graceful, and expressive movements. Dancers perform with verticality, turnout, and specific techniques to

- create a light and ethereal quality.
- Clogging: A folk dance characterized by rhythmic footwork and percussive sounds made by the dancer's shoes, evolving from a blend of European folk dances and African rhythms.
- Contemporary-Funk: This WEAVE original style combines contemporary dance with hip hop elements. It blends technical precision with a powerful, grounded, and often percussive quality.
- Hip Hop: A dynamic and street-style dance form that originated from hip-hop culture. It encompasses a variety of styles, including popping, locking, waving, and grooving.
- Horton Modern: A vigorous and athletic modern dance technique developed by Lester Horton that focuses on a full range of motion, spatial awareness, and anatomical principles.
- Improv: This class focuses on the spontaneous creation of movement without pre-planned choreography to develop self-expression, musicality, and confidence.
- Lyrical: A fluid and emotive dance style that blends elements of ballet, jazz, and contemporary. Dancers interpret the lyrics and emotions of a song to tell a story.
- Musical Theatre: A theatrical dance style that tells a story or expresses a character's emotions through movement, often drawing from jazz, hip hop, or lyrical with dramatic flair.
- Tap: A dynamic form of dance where performers create rhythmic sounds by striking the floor with special shoes fitted with metal taps, making the dancer both a musician and a mover.
- Turns: A class dedicated to mastering various turning techniques from different dance styles, such as pirouettes, fouettés, and chaînés, focusing on spotting, balance, and core strength.
- Weavenique: This WEAVE original class is a specialized technique class focused on developing a
 dancer's ability to execute various jumps, leaps, and extensions with precision, strength, and
 artistry.



Part 3: Studio Policies & Procedures



Registration, Tuition & Fees

Our pricing is per style, not per class. If a style is offered more than once a week, all classes are included in one style package.

Registration: A non-refundable annual registration fee of \$45 is charged upon first signing up for all monthly plans. This fee is only charged again if you cancel your membership and then return.

 - 4+ Styles (Unlimited): \$150/month
- Adult Program:
 - Single Class: \$20
 - o 5-Class Pass: \$65
 - o 10-Class Pass: \$99

Other Required Costs:

- Performances: All students (12th grade and under) are required to participate in our productions. A showcase fee of \$75 will be charged 30 days prior to the Christmas and Spring performances. The Summer Showcase fee is discounted to \$50. This fee covers partial venue and rehearsal fees.
- Costumes: Additional costume items will be required for purchase for all performances.
- Tickets: Anyone coming to the show (including parents, family, and friends) will be required to purchase a ticket.

Membership: Pausing & Canceling

Your membership will continue for life for our year-round program until you cancel. We do not track your attendance and cancel your membership when you stop coming. All cancellations must be sent to info@weavedancecompany.com to process your 30-day notice. This understanding of our cancellation procedure is required to sign upon signing up for our program.

- To Cancel: You must provide a 30-day written notice to info@weavedancecompany.com. This means you must cancel at least 30 days before you want your membership to end. If not, expect one more charge before your membership cancels.
- To Pause: You can pause your membership once per year for 1-2 months. To go on pause, email info@weavedancecompany.com. If you cancel your membership during your pause, your account will automatically be charged a cancellation fee of one term of your monthly tuition.

Attendance, Tardiness & Make-Up Classes

Consistent attendance is critical for a dancer's progress and the overall progress of the class. While you won't be "kicked out" of our program, we recommend training weekly and only missing for sickness

- Absences: If your dancer will be absent, please cancel your class reservation on our app. App details are sent to clients that have signed their agreement.
- Tardiness: Punctuality is expected, but we understand that sometimes things happen! If you will be late please message us through the app or text 423-954-0115.
- Make Up Classes: We do not offer makeup classes unless we cancel the classes for unplanned reasons such as weather closings.

Drop Off & Pick Up

- Drop Off: Students in our leveled program may be dropped off no earlier than 5 minutes before class. Wittle Weavin students must have a parent on the property at all times.
- Pick Up: Pick up time must be promptly at the end of class.
- Supervision: Students are only supervised during their enrolled class time (and the 5 minutes between classes).
- Authorized Pick Up Person: The only people allowed to pick up a student will be those listed as
 the parent/guardian or the emergency contact on the student's account. To add an additional
 pick-up person, please please message us. We will not allow students to go home with unknown
 people.

Dress Code: A Unified and Professional Look

A dress code is enforced to promote discipline, unity, and safety. Proper dance attire allows instructors to see a dancer's alignment and musculature clearly, enabling them to provide effective corrections and prevent injury. Dress code for classes consists of items we sell on the WEAVE Wear Shop (more information upon joining). Adults are not required to adhere to the dress code.

Depending on the class(es)/style(s) you are enrolled in, you can expect to spend between \$50-\$150 for your initial dance wear costs.

We do offer FREE Weave Wear Dress Code Items as part of our Rewards & Loyalty program. Earn points by booking classes, referring friends and writing 5 star Google reviews. Redeem your points for free weave wear items!

Health, Safety & Injury Policy

The health of our dancers is our top priority.

- Injuries: A dancer who sustains an injury must notify their instructor immediately. If injured outside the studio, please inform us. If seen at the doctor, send a doctor's note to us physically or electronically. The student may be asked to observe class to continue learning without risk of further harm.
- Practicing at Home: We encourage practice at home. However, for safety, dancers should never attempt new or advanced skills without instructor supervision.

Discipline Policy

Classroom etiquette is important at Weave. Our goal is to ensure every student has a focused and positive learning experience, and this requires a supportive, respectful environment.

If a student receives a gentle, corrective notice from an instructor (for example, "Please hold questions until I'm finished speaking," or "Let's focus on staying in our designated spots") and the disruptive behavior continues, the instructor will take steps to help the student **reset** and refocus.

Our Reset Procedure:

- 1. Short Break: The student may be asked to sit down for a short period outside of the dancing space within the studio to take a deep breath and regain focus. This brief break allows them to compose themselves without losing the thread of the class.
- 2. Director Discussion: For repeated or persistent disruptions, the student may be asked to speak with Mr. Travis, our Executive Director, or a member of the office staff. This is a brief conversation in the lobby to discuss their behavior, understand the importance of classroom rules, and find a path forward before they are welcomed back into the class.

Why This is Important:

- For the Student: These steps are not punitive; they are opportunities for growth. Learning discipline, focus, and respect for the instructor and peers are essential life skills that directly translate to artistic success. A brief reset allows the dancer to return to class ready to learn effectively.
- For the Class: Consistent adherence to etiquette ensures the instructor can safely and efficiently teach the curriculum. Disruptions slow down the pace of learning and take valuable time away from the entire class, potentially impacting the group's ability to master choreography or technique before performances. We are committed to maximizing the learning experience for every dancer.

Part 4: The Weave Experience



Code of Conduct (for Students, Parents, and Staff)

A positive, respectful, and supportive environment is essential.

- Student Expectations: Show respect for instructors and peers. Come to class with a positive attitude, ready to learn. Students are expected to not talk while the instructor is talking and to participate fully in class. Younger students may get additional grace as they are still learning how to handle themselves in a dance class.
- Parent & Guardian Expectations: Encourage your child positively. Trust our faculty's
 professional judgment. Schedule a time to speak with office staff for concerns; do not approach
 instructors between classes. For non-emergency concerns, we ask that you wait 24 hours before
 contacting the studio to promote calm, productive conversations. Refrain from gossip.

• Anti-Bullying Policy: Weave Dance Company has a zero-tolerance policy for bullying of any kind. Any reported incidents will be taken seriously and may result in dismissal from the studio.

Studio & Lobby Etiquette

- Please supervise siblings at all times in the waiting area.
- Help us keep our shared spaces clean.
- No food or drink, other than water in a sealed container, is permitted inside the dance studios
- Label all personal belongings. Weave Dance Company is not responsible for lost or stolen items

Parent Observation Policy & Review

To maintain a focused learning environment, our studio rooms are not open for parent observation during regular classes.

However, we invite parents and guardians to join us for Review!

We reserve the last 5 minutes of every class for a brief process we call Review. During this time, all students transition to the Hard Studio (our main studio space) to perform a short segment of the material they worked on that day. This may include a combination, a technical skill demonstration, or a few minutes of choreography.

The purpose of Review is two-fold: it provides a quick glimpse into your dancer's progress, and it is a critical tool for building performance skills. Since students have an audience (parents/guardians/staff) every week, they learn to confidently dance in front of others.

Benefit	Description	
Performance Preparation	It desensitizes students to having an audience, making recitals and performances less intimidating and more enjoyable.	
Increased Confidence	Regular, low-pressure performance opportunities build self-esteem and stage presence naturally.	
Accountability & Focus	Knowing they will perform for an audience encourages students to remain focused and work hard throughout the class.	
Growth for Shy Dancers	For introverted or shy children, this routine creates a safe, expected structure for performing, gradually easing them into the spotlight with a familiar audience.	

We encourage you to arrive 5 minutes early to observe the Review period for your dancer's class!

Once you join our program, you will receive a link to download our members only app. You can use our app for:

- Booking in Advance: All students must have their spot reserved in each class they take online via our app. A link to download our app will be sent upon registering.
- Shop & Dress Code: The complete list of dress code items that you need to purchase

Part 5: Performances & Events

Showcase & Recital Information

Performing is an integral part of dance education. All students in 12th grade and under are required to participate in our two annual productions: the Christmas Spectacular and the Spring Showcase, as well as our Summer Showcase (if in town). Important information regarding mandatory dress rehearsals, show dates, times, and ticket sales will be distributed prior to each performance.

Costume Policies

- Costumes will be announced at least 3 weeks before the show
- Costumes must be ordered by the parents. We provide links to our Weave Wear Store and/or outside sources.
- The costumes that you order are your responsibility.
- If you don't have the costume, you may not be able to perform on stage.

The Weave Apprentice Company: Competition with Integrity

For the dancer seeking a higher level of commitment, we offer the Weave Apprentice Company. Our competitive program is founded on the philosophy that competition should be a tool for artistic

growth, teamwork, and personal development, rather than solely on winning trophies. Participation requires a significant commitment of time, energy, and finances. A detailed packet outlining all expectations, rehearsal schedules, and fees is available by request for interested families.
